THE COUNCIL OF STATE AND TERRITORIAL EPIDEMIOLOGISTS

Funded a 1-year, \$30,000 grant to the Rocky Mountain Tribal Epidemiology Center to assess substance use and behavioral health data surveillance needs for tribes throughout Montana and Wyoming.

2016 RMTEC OBJECTIVES

Convene a CSTE workgroup comprised of tribal, state, and local professionals.

Assess surveillance capacity across tribal jurisdictions.

Document how tribes are conducting surveillance activities for substance use and behavioral health clients.



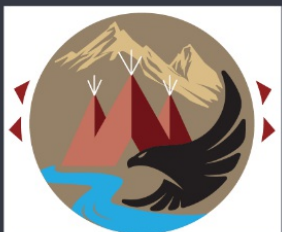
2017 RMTEC OBJECTIVES

Support Tribal Action Planning by linking existing RMTEC data access and reports to community needs.

Identify surveillance approaches that track emerging drug use, distribution patterns, and related behavioral health disorders.

Develop recommendations for how to develop improved surveillance systems for substance use and behavioral health data in tribal communities.
